Ivadell J. Korgis, 96, of Kankakee went home to be with her Lord and Savior this past Sunday, March 12, 2017 at Heritage Health Care Center, Gibson City, IL. She was born January 25, 1921 in Sibley, IA to Neal and Edna (Dagel) Bowman. Ivadell married Stanley P. Korgis in 1939 and he died July 9, 1971.

Even though she was primarily a stay at home mom, she was forced to go out and work after Stanley died at the age of 56. So at age 50, she began working in different occupations, some of which were a meat cutter in Jewel's Deli, and a cook for various places around town, including A.O. Smith, the Fairview Inn and a restaurant in Herscher. Ivadell always made people laugh. She loved to watch Charles Stanley, Andy Stanley and David Jeremiah on T.V., crochet, decorate her home with flowers pictures and knickknacks. Ivadell enjoyed doing puzzle books and often said "I have to do my homework." She loved the Lord and is with Him now!

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law Russell (Caroline) Korgis of MO, 2 daughters and a son-in-law; Janice Kuntz of Paxton, June (John) Johnston of Kankakee. Also surviving are multiple grandchildren, numerous great grandchildren and great great grandchildren. She was a mom to many.

Ivadell was preceded in death by her parents, husband; Stanley and numerous brothers and sisters and several grandchildren. She is reunited with them and having the time of her life, but only after seeing Jesus and getting a big hug and a welcome home my child! She will be missed Greatly!
