



## Paul Meyering

August 7, 1938 - June 23, 2021

Reverend Paul Meyering, 82, of Homewood, IL passed away at his home on June 23, 2021. Paul was born on August 7, 1938 in Chicago Heights, IL to Clarence and Effie Meyering.

He served in the United States Army and was stationed in Germany during the Berlin crisis of 1961, culminating in the erection of the Berlin Wall.

He was employed for Ford Motor Company in Hegewisch, IL for 10 years.

He graduated from the Nazarene Bible College in Colorado Springs, CO in 1974 and was an ordained Minister for the Church of the Nazarene where he served the Lord for 26 years.

He was employed for the Palos Heights School District 118 for 11 years.

His admiration of classic cars was his greatest hobby. He owned countless cars during his life and had a wealth of knowledge from his book collection. He loved going to museums and whenever a classic car came into view, he loved to call out the make, model and year.
