June 15, 1922 - June 28, 2018

Warner Diefenbach, 96, of Bonfield passed away on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at the home and farm where he lived his entire life. He was born on June 15, 1922 in Bonfield, the son of Louis and Anna (Piper) Diefenbach.

Warner was a 1940 graduate from Herscher High School and an FFA Alumni. He took over the family farm at a young age and became a lifelong and respected dairy and grain farmer. He was a member of the Kankakee County Farm Bureau since 1946 and was an associate and elected Director of the Kankakee County Soil and Water for 27 years. He enjoyed going to farm meetings, C.I.G.C. monthly meetings and Kids Day at the farm. He later became a member of the Central IL Green Club.

He was an active member and served in many of the positions at Grand Prairie United Methodist Church; and was also involved in their work missions –traveling outside the United States 14 times. A lover of music, he sang more than 65 years in the church choir, both solos and duets.

Warner and his late sister, Florence Rose lived together and kept the home farm in operation. They participated in the Rural-Urban Exchange Program sponsored by the A.M.P.I. Dairy Association.

His favorite sports teams were the Chicago Cubs and Chicago Bears.

Warner is survived by many Diefenbach relatives, his Grand Prairie Church family, and his farming neighbors & friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and his sister Florence Rose Diefenbach.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, July 10, 2018 from 9am until the 11am funeral service at Grand Prairie United Methodist Church in Bonfield. Burial will follow at Grand Prairie Cemetery. Memorials may be made to Grand Prairie United Methodist Church or the Grand Prairie Cemetery.
