Aldo "Al" Filafusi, age 91, of Kankakee, passed away Thursday, May 6, 2021 at AMITA St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee.

Al was born August 10, 1929 in Chicago, the son of Matthew & Theresa DiGeralomo Filafusi.

Al attended Bennett School in Chicago and Tilden Tech High School. He completed one year of training on appraising 1 to 4 units and 6 months training on performing FHA inspection.
