



Dr. Rev. George Miller

June 18, 1936 - December 6, 2014

When reflecting on the life of Dr. Rev. George Miller, it is easy to see that his life was about faith, family, and serving others. He was an accomplished yet humble man who was intentional in everything he did. A devoted husband and father, George was thrilled to witness his family tree blossom to include six grandchildren who were his greatest source of pride and joy. Through his life we are reminded that true happiness is not found in what we have, but that it is through the acts of service we lavish upon those around us that we are richly blessed. Although he will be deeply missed, his tender spirit of generosity will live on in the lives of those too numerous to count. Life in America during the 1930s was anything but easy as the entire decade was cloaked in the hardship of the Great Depression. Jobs became scarce, which sent the unemployment rate soaring to over 25 percent, leaving countless families to do whatever they could to weather the storm. Despite the trials around them, a young couple from Jackson County, West Virginia, was able to shift their focus to a joyous time in their own lives with the birth of a baby boy on June 18, 1936. George was the youngest of 10 children born to his parents, Charley and Blanche McLaughlin Miller, and he was raised on the family farm alongside his siblings, Exmar, Philba, Jack, Zelma, Herbert, Ivan, Helen, Betty, and Fanny Jane. The Miller family was deeply rooted in faith, and although their home was forever a bustle of activity there was always room for anyone who needed a place to stay. George was close with his siblings, and they remained as such throughout their entire lives. Life on the

farm was hard work, but the Miller family made plenty of room for fun, too. George was a student at local schools who went on to graduate from Gilmore High School in 1954. Shortly thereafter, George enlisted in the United States Army. Serving from 1955 through 1957, part of his time in the military was spent working as a company clerk for his unit while in Korea following the Korean Conflict. New and exciting changes were in store for George when he met the young girl of his dreams. Her name was Sharon Townsend, and it wasn't long after meeting that the couple found themselves deeply in love. With a desire to establish a life together, George and his sweetheart became husband and wife on June 11, 1966, in Parkersburg, West Virginia. Together they were overjoyed to welcome three children including Dawn, Danette, and Derick into their hearts and home. George was an active part of his children's lives, and he loved playing with them whether it was basketball, softball, or board games. He also came up with his own games that were designed to increase his children's vocabulary and Bible memorization skills. The Millers often sang as a group, and since George and Sharon were blessed with the gift of hospitality their home was always full of laughter, music, good food, and friends. Because George had a strong work ethic throughout his life, this was a trait he modeled for his children, too, and he commonly came alongside them in their work including everything from yard work and gardening to canning and having father son time with Derick while chopping wood. Around the house George was able to fix anything whether it be mechanical, technical, or construction related. As his children became adults, the relationship they shared only grew deeper as George became their trusted friend, confidante, and wise advisor as they frequently sought his counsel. Their family grew to include six grandchildren, Seth, Landon, Kaitlyn, Logan, McKenzie, and Lydia. Both George and Sharon were very much a part of their grandchildren's lives as they were regularly planning family vacations, attending school events, athletic games, and performances as they arose. His family continued to be a cornerstone in George's life, and he made spending time together a priority. Sunday dinners as a family were a tradition, and one

could count on a call at the end of the week to plan the menu for that Sunday's meal. George made a career in the ministry, and with his servant's heart it was a perfect fit. He was ordained by the Evangelical Church Alliance in 1978. After pastoring in West Virginia, he became the pastor of Faith Chapel in Harrisburg, Illinois, from 1981 through 1988. From there George joined the staff of the Evangelical Church Alliance in Bradley, Illinois, in 1988, and he later became President and CEO. Most recently, George held the position of Military Chaplain Commission Director. In addition, he served as the Senior Pastor of River Valley Christian Fellowship in Bourbonnais from 1993 to 2006, and in 2006 he became the Pastor of Congregational Care. Under George's leadership, every church and organization flourished and expanded during his tenure, which resulted in three church facility expansions and the Evangelical Church Alliance becoming the third largest Military Chaplain Endorser in the United States. He was also very thankful that he had the privilege of serving in ministry with Derick for 23 years. In his leisure time George continued to live fully. He enjoyed traveling throughout the United States, and he also traveled the world including leading groups on a pilgrimage to Israel on five separate occasions. George was so proud to have been used as an instrument of God with humble beginnings as a young farm boy to ministering to countless others in places he could never even dream of. An active man, he also enjoyed golfing, bowling, and playing games since he was also known for his competitive nature. Southern gospel music, watching the Cubs, Bulls, and Bears, and securing a bargain were also favorites. Of course nothing was better than sharing his life with his loved ones. Friends were always an important part of his life, and he had friends from back when he was a young boy. With his warm and genuine personality, George had countless friends whom he worked alongside, traveled with, or just had good old fashioned fun with. During the past 21 months of his life, he was blessed with a priceless relationship with Debra Minton, which was a source of much love and joy. All who knew Dr. Rev. George Miller would agree that he was

truly extraordinary. He loved nothing more than sharing his faith, spending time with his friends and loved ones, and making others laugh. George was a man of honor, high moral convictions, and compassion who lived his life with both grace and truth. George will never be forgotten. Dr. Rev. George Miller, of Bourbonnais, died on December 6, 2014. George's family includes, his fiancé Debra Minton of Bourbonnais, IL; brother, Ivan Miller of Barberton, OH; two sisters, Helen Hinzman of Ripley, WV and Fanny Jane Hascue of Sandyville, WV; daughter, Dawn (Darrin) Moss of Bourbonnais; daughter, Danette Barker of Yorktown, VA; and son, Derick (Teresa) Miller of Bradley; six grandchildren, Seth Barker of Yorktown, VA, Landon Miller of Columbus, GA, Logan and Lydia Miller of Bradley, Kaitlynn and McKenzie Evans of Bourbonnais. George was preceded in death by his wife, Sharon; brothers, Exmar Miller, Philba Miller, Jack Miller, and Herbert Miller; and sisters, Zelma Louiseau and Betty Channell. Visitation will be held Tuesday, December 9th, 3 - 8 p.m. at River Valley Christian Fellowship, Bourbonnais. A funeral service will be held Wednesday, December 10th, 11 a.m. at River Valley Christian Fellowship.
