



Ronald Mitchell

July 18, 1925 - January 9, 2015

Ronald "Gene" Mitchell, 89, of Bourbonnais, passed away from natural causes on Friday (Jan. 9, 2015) at his home. He was born on July 18, 1925, in Olney, (Richland County), the son of Orvall O. and Sadie E. Mitchell. He was then raised in Westfield (Clark County). Basketball, track, band, plus Future Farmers of America and farm work were among his many activities in his earlier years. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1946, part of which was on a destroyer in the Atlantic, the USS Meredith DD-890. Gene graduated from the University of Illinois with a bachelor's degree in agriculture. His life work included nearly 37 years with the U.S. Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service in the Columbus, Ohio area, then as an Illinois District Conservationist in the counties of DeKalb and Kankakee. While in DeKalb, he obtained a master's degree in business administration at Northern Illinois University. On Oct. 14, 1951, he married Ruby M. Johnson, in Hillsboro. They had three children, Stephen G., Thomas K., and Marilyn M. Mitchell. Ruby preceded him in death on Oct. 1, 1991. On May 15, 1999, Gene married June I. Krause at Asbury United Methodist Church in Kankakee, where both were members and in the same church school class. June's former husband, Walter E. Krause, had passed away in December of 1990. Her two sons are Dr. David E. Krause and Dr. Donald E. Krause, both of Bourbonnais. Gene taught adult church school class, served on church committees, sang in the church choir, served as president of Kiwanis Club of Kankakee, volunteered at Riverside Medical Center in Kankakee, and

assisted in the classroom with the Adult Literacy Program at Kankakee Community College. Preceding him in death were his parents; all of his siblings, including a newborn, Betty Mitchell, James (Harriett) Mitchell, and Jeanette (Erwin) Duzan. Surviving are his wife, June; sons, Stephen (Betty) Mitchell, of Normal, and Dr. Thomas (Lisa) Mitchell, of Raleigh, N.C.; daughter, Marilyn (Horacio) Acevedo, of St. Anne; grandchildren, Isabel (Bernard) Sam, Heidi (Matthew) Duckworth, Quincy (Michelle) Mitchell, David Mitchell, Celeste Mitchell, Evonne (Leif) Johnson, and Aaron (Cathlin) Acevedo; great-grandsons, Solomon Sam and Ezequias Sam; great-granddaughter, Elisheba Sam; step-granddaughters, Dr. Rebecca (Trevor) Sierra, Dr. Sharon (Dustin) Molitoris, and Julie (Derek) Richardson; step-grandsons, Matthew Krause and Andrew Krause; step-granddaughters, Dr. Laurie (Michael) Gauthier and Emily Krause; step-great-granddaughters, Adelyn Molitoris and Maya Sierra; stepsons-in-law, Dr. David E.
