James “Skip” Bowers and Josephine “Jo” Bowers of Kankakee, Illinois, shared nearly 68 years of devoted marriage before Jo’s passing on December 23, 2022, followed by Skip’s on September 16, 2025. Together, they built a life grounded in family, service, faith, and quiet strength. Now reunited, they rest together in eternal peace.

Both Skip and Jo were born in Clifton, Illinois—Skip on September 9, 1932, and Jo on April 2, 1934. They married on January 22, 1955, and raised two children, James and Jeanette, in a home filled with love, laughter, and enduring values passed down through generations.

Skip served in the U.S. Army as a cook in the 3rd Armored Division at Fort Knox, Kentucky, earning the rank of Corporal and an honorable discharge. He spent many years as a groundskeeper and florist at Kankakee State Hospital (now Shapiro Developmental Center), where he found purpose and peace in the natural world. An entrepreneur at heart, he later owned a landscaping business and partnered in a pest control company. More than just work, nature was Skip’s sanctuary—a place he loved to share with others. He mentored many, including Roger and Andy Bowers, Dan Hanson, and Dave Ciaccio, who followed in his footsteps.

Even in retirement, Skip remained dedicated to helping others. Through the Bowers Foundation, he distributed clothing, food, and household goods to those in need—quietly touching countless lives. A lifelong learner and creative spirit, Skip was a lover of books and poetry, a master of crossword puzzles, and at age 75, fulfilled a dream by writing and recording a song, “Autumn Gold,” which aired on local radio. He also found joy in museums, music, and the theater—interests he shared with his family, leaving behind a lifetime of cherished memories.

Jo was the heart of the home—steady, kind, and full of grace. She worked hard both inside and outside the home, holding roles as a waitress, housecleaner, and longtime school bus driver. She loved the children she transported, treating each one with care and affection. Jo's warmth, generosity, and quiet strength touched everyone she met. She delighted in music and musicals, and was an avid reader who especially loved the novels of Zane Grey and Danielle Steele. Her home was always a place of comfort and care.

Though never ones to seek the spotlight, Skip and Jo's gentle strength, humility, and generosity left a lasting impression on everyone fortunate enough to know them. As parents, they led by example—showing what it meant to be kind, loyal, and endlessly giving. Their legacy lives on not only in their family, but in the many lives they quietly uplifted along the way.

Together, Skip and Jo created a life rich in love, laughter, and unwavering support—for each other, their family, and their community. They filled their home with creativity and compassion, sharing books, music, and the arts with their loved ones, building a legacy of kindness and connection.

They are survived by their children, James Kevin Bowers (Carol) and Jeanette Bowers Fritz (Mark); grandchildren, James Andrew Bowers (Cathy), Kristie Bowers DeLuca (Peter), Stephanie Bowers Mackin (Andrew), Bridgette Fritz Martin, and Benjamin Fritz; and great-grandchildren, Hailey "Alvi" Bowers, Kinsley Mackin, Briggs Mackin, Oliver Martin, and Ruth DeLuca.
