Arthur L. Sanor, 88, of Bradley passed away at Riverside Medical Center, Sunday January 11, 2015. Arthur, a longtime resident of Bradley, retired to New Mexico/Arizona, returned to the Bradley area 11 months ago. He was born November 6, 1926 in Bradley, IL the son of Raymond and Frances (Mathews) Sanor. He married Shirley Jarvis Maltby in November, 1969 in Bradley who preceded him in death. Mr. Sanor was a self-employed photographer for 25 years, owner and operator of Art's Cliff House Chinese Restaurant in Bradley for 13 years and the co-owner of Dutch Mill in Gilman for 3 years. Art graduated from Bradley High school in 1944 and attended the Ray School of Photography, He served 2 years in the United States Navy during WWII on the USS Ostara. Arthur received the American Area Ribbon, the Victory Ribbon and the Asiatic Pacific Ribbon. He is a member of the American Legion Post 766, a Life Member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6502 of Bradley and a Life Member of the Illinois Licensed Beverage Association and the Kankakee Valley Beverage Association. He was a member of St. Joseph's Parish in Bradley where he was an usher for 40 years.
