Father John Thomas Antczak 78 of Bradley, IL. Passed away Sunday December 28, 2014 at Miller Rehabilitation Center in Kankakee, Illinois. He was born January 10, 1936 in Chicago Illinois to John and Helen Antczak. He attended St. Mark Our Lady of Good Counsel Grammar schools in Chicago, Quigley Preparatory Seminary in Chicago and St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois. Father Antczak was ordained May 25, 1963 and has served in the Joliet Diocese as Associate at St. Peter in Itasca, Illinois from 1963 to 1964, St. Rose and St Teresa in Kankakee, Illinois from 1964 to 1980, and St. Joseph in Bradley, Illinois. For the past 28 years Father Antczak has served as Chaplain at Riverside Medical Center while residing at St. Joseph in Bradley. Father touched the lives of many in his ministry with a spirit of selflessness and humility. His sense of humor and quick wit were gifts that he shared with all. Father Antczak is preceded in death by his father and mother, John and Helen Antczak, and one sister Audrey Kramer.
