Ronald W. Gaines, 79 of Chebanse passed away November 12, 2015 at Riverside Medical Center. He was born February 28, 1936 in Kankakee to Donald W. and Wilda (Wooleridge) Gaines and was raised in Carmi, IL. Ron served in the U.S. Army from 1955 to 1959. He married Virginia Schroeder October 22, 2005. Ronald was an avid artist and taught a cartoon class for the Kankakee county park district. He worked at Bunge Foods and retired in 2007. Ron also volunteered for KC-CASA, he was an umpire, a member of Toastmasters and an avid Chicago Cubs and Bears fan.

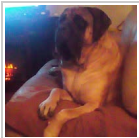

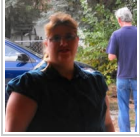
