



## Sheila Harris Neuby

September 7, 1929 - December 13, 2017

Sheila Harris Neuby, 88, passed away at St. Mary's Hospital on Wednesday, December 13th. She was born on September 7, 1929 to Margaret Georgia (nee Harris) and William Roy Freborg, both of Kankakee. Sheila was raised by her maternal grandparents Earl C. and Bertha L. Harris.

On May 23, 1953, she married Harold B. Neuby who preceded her in death in June of 2015. Also deceased is their son, William, Died April 28, 1954.

Surviving is their daughter, Barbara L. Neuby, Ph.D., Professor of Public Administration at Kennesaw State University in Kennesaw, Georgia, and sister-in-law Grace Neuby Chisholm (and family) of Gretna, Louisiana, nephew Ronald Palmateer, wife Gloria, and family of Bourbonnais.

Sheila had many special friends including her friend of 70 years, Dorothy Schmitz, of Bradley, Dorothy and Ruben Riegel of Bonfield, Ms. Linda Fritz, Mrs. Sue Chouinard, Ms. Cindy Kallsen, Ms. Barbara McGrath, Mr. William Klopp, and Ms. Becky Bellman, all of Kankakee, and Ms. Judy Nikodem of Bourbonnais.

Sheila spent most of her working life in the paper industry. Employers include the Tampa Tribune-Times, Tampa, Florida; Imperial International Learning, where she helped design children's books and educational materials; and Riverwoods International, of Kankakee and from which she retired as Graphic Arts Coordinator in the manufacture of folding cartons. She was also partner and part owner of the family printing business, Economy Printing, where she did all the design work until 1996.

A lover of all animals, Sheila was especially fond of cats. She never met a cat she didn't like. A memorial service will be celebrated at a later date and family and friends will be notified to celebrate her life. Remembrances may be made to the Humane Foundation of Kankakee or to the donor's choice, in her name. Sheila enriched the lives of those who knew her and if you didn't know Sheila, you missed something. May God rest her soul.
